With reference to your email dated 25 March 2009 I wish to advise that following discussions with the relevant Officers I have been advised that periodic cleaning is undertaken to ensure that traffic directional signs and signage along the walkway is clearly visible to motorists, pedestrians and cyclists. There are driveways that transect the pathway and the sight lines to

these need to be re- established and maintained. Under CPTED (Crime Prevention through Environmental Design) guidelines, Council is required to ensure that open space areas are maintained to ensure the safety and well being of the general public.

In regard to the revegetation I have been advised that these works will be undertaken in the near future following the return from leave of the Supervisor for the area.
