- 3) No details of community activities given
- 4) Candidate comments *I will fight for what residents require of me. There are parts of Division One that will suffer immensely under the MBRC planning scheme and the residents of these areas are calling for something to be done. I will listen to their concerns and work with all relevant departments, stakeholders and residents to deliver an outcome that is agreeable for all. However, I will not support those with vested interests to alter the plan to achieve their own personal gain.*
- 5) Candidate comments that these are approved Council policies and there is little ability for Councillors to change or modify or oppose them. Candidate comments that where electors might be negatively affected by these policies or any tree and vegetation protection and maintenance policy that might be developed..... *if I'm elected I would be available to meet with those who have concerns so that I can determine the full range of issues about these documents and then together we can work out a way forward.*
- 6) Candidate supports this goal but comments that it may not always be possible given the current processes of Council. Candidate further comments..... *I would hope that community groups and concerned residents would share their concerns, so that when things are presented without prior notice I would be aware of the issues and then could confidently speak on behalf of the community.* (Note: Candidate has supplied further comments on MBI Facebook).
- 7) In 2012 and in response to ratepayer complaints, MBRC appointed outside consultants, Acclaim Corporate Services, to investigate those complaints and report back to Council. Acclaim's Interim and Final Reports were also forwarded to the CMC. In his letter of 24/01/2013 to complainants following the submission of Acclaim's Final Report, MBRC's CEO advises that..... *Mr Whyte.. has not portrayed Council in a positive light as he showed a lack of environmental awareness and people skills necessary to effectively discharge his functions adequately and represent Council in a positive light.*
The CEO further comments....*I wish to advise that the employee has been reprimanded in relation to the outcome of the complaint and his performance will be monitored in the future*
The spokesperson for the complainants comments that a Right to Information (RTI) request was lodged with MBRC to obtain a copy of Acclaim's Reports and any associated documents. MBRC Legal advises that a search of MBRC's files shows that over 700 relevant documents were located but MBRC Legal would only release about 70 fairly innocuous documents from that list. MBRC ratepayers are left to wonder what might be in the documents that MBRC will not release, and they are left to wonder why MBRC Legal will not release them. As the complainant's spokesperson comments... "What is MBRC trying to hide? Are others implicated?"
